Amen



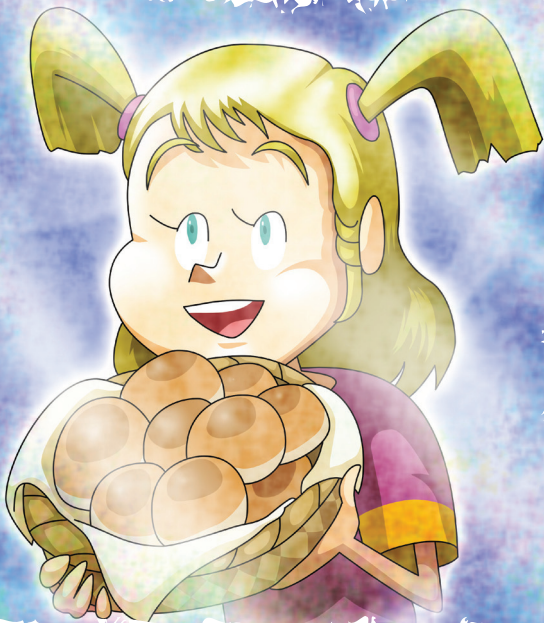
"Amen" is the word we say,

For _____ I do pray. Amen.

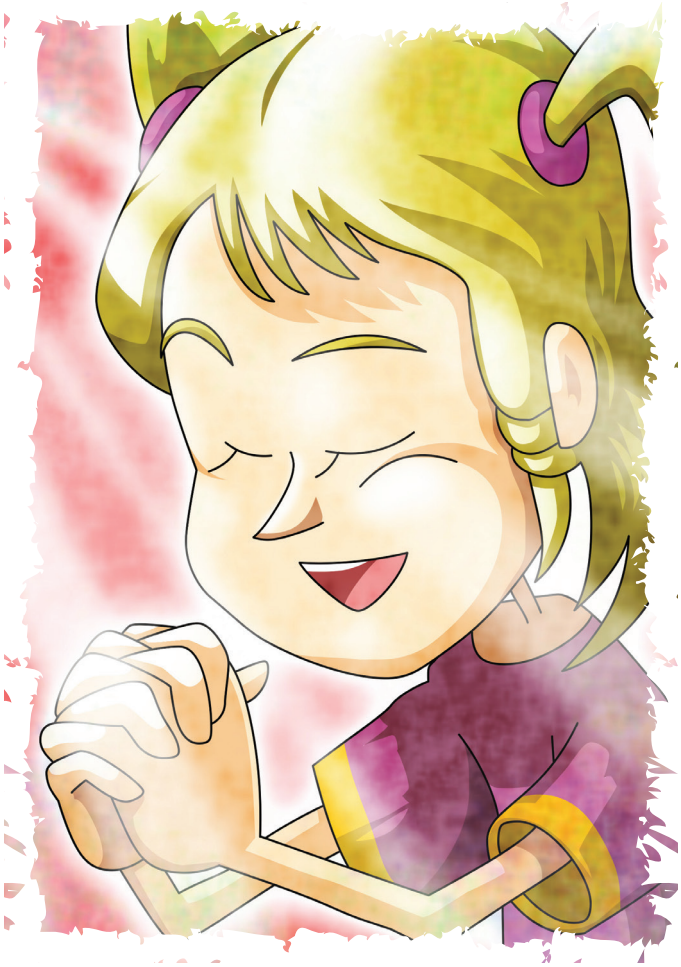


_____ isn't being nice,
